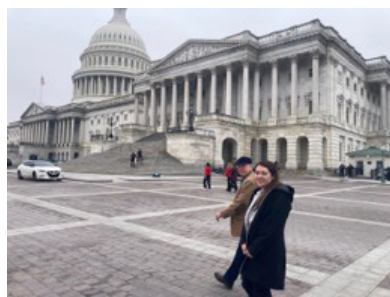
Speaking up for small credit unions
